We would like to submit the information required to decipher the characters contained in our Federal vehicle identification numbers.

The first three characters are RVIA issued as follows: 1 G 9

The fourth character indicates our model line. We have Two lines. A stands for Cargo Trailer to transport Misc. Cargo. C: open car carrier  
B stands for Car Tainer to transport Auto's: A or B

The fifth and sixth stand for Series and Body numbers, which we do not have so these characters are both zero's: 0 0

The seventh character stands for length:

The eighth character stands for axle code: 1 axle = 10, 2 axles = 9  
3 axles = 8, 4 axles = 7.

The ninth section is a check digit.

The tenth section is for year model: E (1984)

The eleventh character is the plant location, we only have one: 1

The 12th 13th and 14th characters were issued by SAE: 0 3 8

The 15th, 16th, and 17th, characters stand for our serial numbers. They start with 100 and go up, 101, 102, 103, etc.
